
PROUD TO BE PARKSIDE WEEKLY NEWSLETTER 03.05.2024

Bronze (5 books, EYFS 20 books): Reading Certificate & Parkside

Bookmark

Silver (10 books, EYFS 40 books): Reading Certificate & Reading Badge **Gold** (20 books, EYFS 70 books): Visit to the Reading Reward Shelf to select a book to keep

Platinum (KS1 35 books & KS2 25 books, EYFS 100 books): Trip to Waterstones & Starbucks with Senior Leaders.

The Senior Leadership Team will also have a termly 'Book Meet' with the child who reads the most amount of books in a term.












